SIX TONS OF PEACHES BURNED AS GARBAGE

A Portland Commission House Put Them in Cold Storage to Wait for Higher Prices

Six tons of peaches from a Portland cold storage plant were taken to the garbage crematory last week and burned. These were consigned to a commission house during the fall and instead of selling them at a low price so that poor people would purchase them, they were placed in cold storage in the hope that prices would advance and they would be able to realize a big profit from them. Instead they all rotted and the city was put to the expense of burning them.

TO START OREGON TRUNK EXTENSION

A Portland dispatch from LaPine, dated Nov. 30, says: The unusual activity of the timber interests, near to the railway circles of influence, who have had in the neighborhood of 15 different crews in the field in the Walker basin for the past three months cruising the timber, coupled with the appearance of contractors at Bend the past week, points to early construction operations on the Oregon Trunk railway right of way south of Bend to LaPine.

Sunday afternoon a crew of 10 men, apparently cruisers, equipped with teams and supplies enough to indicate they expected to be in the field for some time, turned off at the road leading up Paulina creek, seven miles northeast of LaPine, followed the creek to the trappers' cabin, four miles west of Paulina lake, where they are now camped. Three instrument men are said to be in the crew.

Late Saturday night A. Anderson, representing the firm of Hieson & Co., who have the contract to clear the right of way from Bend to LaPine, registered at a local hotel. At daybreak the next morning he inquired of the landlord the way to the cleared portion near this point and followed the right of way on foot to Lava Butte, a distance of about 20 miles. Mr. Anderson had the contract for clearing the right of way in the vicinity of Crescent, 21 miles south of LaPine, in the spring of 1910, when suddenly all work was called off along the entire line from Bend south.

George Nelson of the firm of Nelson Bros., who also in 1910 had a sub-contract to construct 40 miles of the Oregon Trunk, from a point seven miles north of Bend to LaPine, has been at Bend for the past week.

All the above stated facts have given residents of the Walker basin more confidence that railway operations are shortly to be resumed than at any period since the memorable time of May 1910. At that time the contractors had in the neighborhood of 200 men strung out clearing the right of way from Lava Butte south. People by the hundreds from nearly every state in the Union were rushing into the LaPine country.

Land locators, townsite agents and real estate dealers all were on the jump, when suddenly, about the middle of May, all work ceased without warning. The development of the entire Walker basin has been at a standstill since that time.
