Timber in the county: Total acreage, 2,024,231; in forest reserves, 1,194,231 acres; privately owned, 830,000 acres.

Privately owned timber in county: 830,000 acres; 7,000,000,000 feet.

School enrollment: Number of children 4 to 20 years, 2,424; primary, 500; grammar, 1,064; high school, 100; total enrollment, 1,664; average days in school year, 135.

Fred Wallace of Laidlaw, has been endorsed by the water users in that section for water master of the project, and it is understood his appointment is certain.
