apples Arkansas Black, Wagner, White Permain and Jonathan are the best. Cherries, plums, prunes and pears are also grown.

The improvements on this project are not such as the excellence of the land and crops would seem to warrant. On account of the uncertainty that has prevailed and also the lack of the necessary water under the old Columbia Southern Co. many settlers who have contracts for land have remained away. However, those farmers who are now on the project and have their land cleared and in crop are doing nicely. Many of them have good buildings and improvements on their farms.

There is much good stock on this project. Through the instrumentality of different associations good cows and hogs have been shipped both from the east and from the Willamette valley. There are also quite a number of good horses in this section.

The Desert Land Board has made the ruling that contracts shall not be made out for any land until there is water available for it. It was on this point that the old company fell down. They made contracts that they were unable to fulfill, and the contract holders never came to the country.

Now that the state has charge of the project and is pushing it to completion, with an efficient engineer in charge, it seems that the old Columbia Southern, so long held out as an example of irrigation mismanagement, will be a name of the past, and the Tumalo Project will be known throughout the country as an example of the best method of reclaiming arid lands.
