### SPECIAL PRIZES FOR COMING POTATO SHOW

RAILROADS AND OTHERS OFFER PRIZES FOR THE EVENT

Articles Are Useful and Will Be Appreciated by Those Winning Them

The Third Annual Redmond Potato Show and Fair, to be held here October 23, 24 and 25, promises to be an important event in the county. This year the premium committee has eliminated the cattle prizes and added flowers, culinary exhibits and increased the prizes on other exhibits. Special prizes that will be given by railroads and others are as follows:

Great Northern Railway—For the 26 largest and best potatoes, any variety, silver loving cup.

Oregon Trunk Railway—For the largest and best display of different varieties of potatoes, not less than one crate of each, open to all growers, 8-day Seth Thomas bronze clock, value \$85.

O.-W. R. & N. Co.—For the best general exhibit of farm products grown by an individual exhibitor, open to all farmers in Crook county: First prize, one John Deere 50-tooth harrow; one John Deere 5-tooth cultivator. Second prize, one 14-inch plow; one combination cultivator. Above prizes valued at \$50. Third prize, \$5 in cash.

For the best bushel of potatoes, any variety, \$20, by F. S. Stanley of the Central Oregon Irrigation Company.

It is expected that the Northern Pacific Railroad will offer a substantial prize for some part of the exhibit, to be specified later.

#### BANQUET TO MISS FERN HOBBS AT TUMALO PROJECT

### SERMON "GRAIN"

(Communicated.)

On Sunday morning at the Presbyterian church, the pastor, Rev. F. Harvey, discoursed on "Idlers, or Working Out of Christian Destiny." The text being 2 Phil. 12-13, "Working Out Your Own Salvation, for It is God That Worketh in you." President McCormick of Chicago, was quoted that there is a great problem, not only with paupers and vagabonds, but there are 2,000 idle rich who sit around hotels, overfed, doing no good to anybody, not even to themselves, and these idle rich are en route to the scrap pile of wanton waste.

Dr. McClellan of New York says that much mental potentiality is unused; there is a large amount of untrained and unserviceable manhood and womanhood.

After the destruction of Jerusalem in the year 70 A. D., the activities of the Apostles shifted from the land of David and Elijah to Macedonia and South Europe, the homes of Plato, Plutarch and Socrates. Phillip being a colonial city and the seat of one of the early vigorous churches, Paul commends and urges them to utilize their spiritual energy and fulfill their christian career of usefulness and dignity.

After the last great American election, President Wilson modestly declared the event was not one of triumph, but of dedication to a national task. So the christian is militant and aggressive, not yet triumphant. A divine energy is imparted to give momentum to further operations.

The sermon then continued along the following lines: First, The true church is composed of vitalized members; secondly, a divine energy operates to accomplish their christian character; thirdly, it is an imperative duty to achieve the advance of our physical, mental and religious connection.
