The United States District Forester's office has received an allotment of \$22,380.29, which is ten per cent of the national forest revenue collected in Oregon. The entire sum is to be expended on wagon roads in government forests of Oregon. Some of the new roads will open country which heretofore has

Five thousand dollars of this sum will be used to improve the McKenzie wagon road, one of the four roads connecting the eastern and western parts of the state.
