OFFICIAL REPORT OF COUNCIL MEETING

DENTON G. BURDICK APPOINTED CITY RECORDER

New System Proposed for Collection of Water Rents—Proceedings in Full

Redmond, Or., Jan. 13, 1914.

Regular meeting of the common council of the city of Redmond, Oregon, held at the office of the recorder on the 13th day of January, 1914.

Present: Mayor Hosch, Councilmen Immele, Phoenix, DeSouza, Atkinson, Farris, and Reedy. Meeting called to order by Mayor Hosch. Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

On motion the following bills were allowed and ordered paid:

The annual message of the mayor, containing a brief resume of the operations of the city since its incorporation, and a full and complete statement of its present financial condition, was read, and on motion received and placed on file.

Ordinance No. 35, granting to the Deschutes Mutual Telephone Co. and assigns the right to erect, maintain and operate in the city of Redmond, Crook county, Oregon, and in the

streets, alleys, avenues and thoroughfares thereof, wires and other conductors for the transmission of electricity, read, and on motion referred to the Ordinance committee.

On motion the city attorney was instructed to prepare the proper resolution for the construction of sidewalk as follows: On west side of 8th street from D to A; on south side of A street from 8th to 10th; on north side of A street from 6th to the canal; on north side of E street from 9th to 12th; on south side of C street from 7th to 8th; on west side of 7th street from E to G; on south side of F street from 7th to 8th, and on west side of 8th from F to H, and to present the same at the next meeting of the council.

Application of Herman J. Love for a transfer of the permit to sell intoxicating liquors now held by S. D. Fox, presented, and on motion said transfer was granted, to take effect upon the filing with the recorder of a bond in the sum of \$1000, conditioned as provided by ordinance.

Sealed bids for the city printing for the year 1914 having been filed by The Redmond Spokesman and the Enterprise, the same were opened and read. Moved and seconded that the bid submitted by The Spokesman be accepted. Carried.

Treasurer's report read, and on motion approved and ordered placed on file.

Moved and seconded that meters be installed upon the service pipes of all water users by the 1st day of April, 1914. Carried.

On motion the water committee was instructed to repair the same at the pumping station and make such other repairs in the system as they deem necessary.

The mayor announced the appointment of the following committees:

Licenses—H. F. DeSouza, R. C. Immele, F. G. Atkinson.
Streets and Alleys—F. G. Atkinson, H. F. DeSouza, R. C. Immele.

BEND HAS ANOTHER FIRE

Good Work of the Firemen Prevent Spread of Flames

A Bend dispatch of the 12th says: Fire starting in the Vienna cafe on Wall street early this morning destroyed the building in which were located the restaurant and Bert Shuey's grocery store. Fanned by a strong wind the flames leaped across the street and broke plate glass windows and scorched buildings on half a block, the property being saved only by the hard work of the volunteers. The two story brick building belonging to E. A. Sather, next to the frame two story structure in which the fire started withstood the fierce heat well and was only slightly damaged. Had it burned it is believed it would have been impossible to have saved the town, with the wind blowing as it was. Half of Shuey's stock was carried out and saved. His loss about \$1000, fully insured. The Vienna cafe did not save anything and carried only \$500 insurance. The building was owned by W. F. Farris of Portland. Shuey was to have moved January 1 into a new brick building, but it was turned over to Rev. E. J. Hulgu, who is using it as a revival meeting place.
