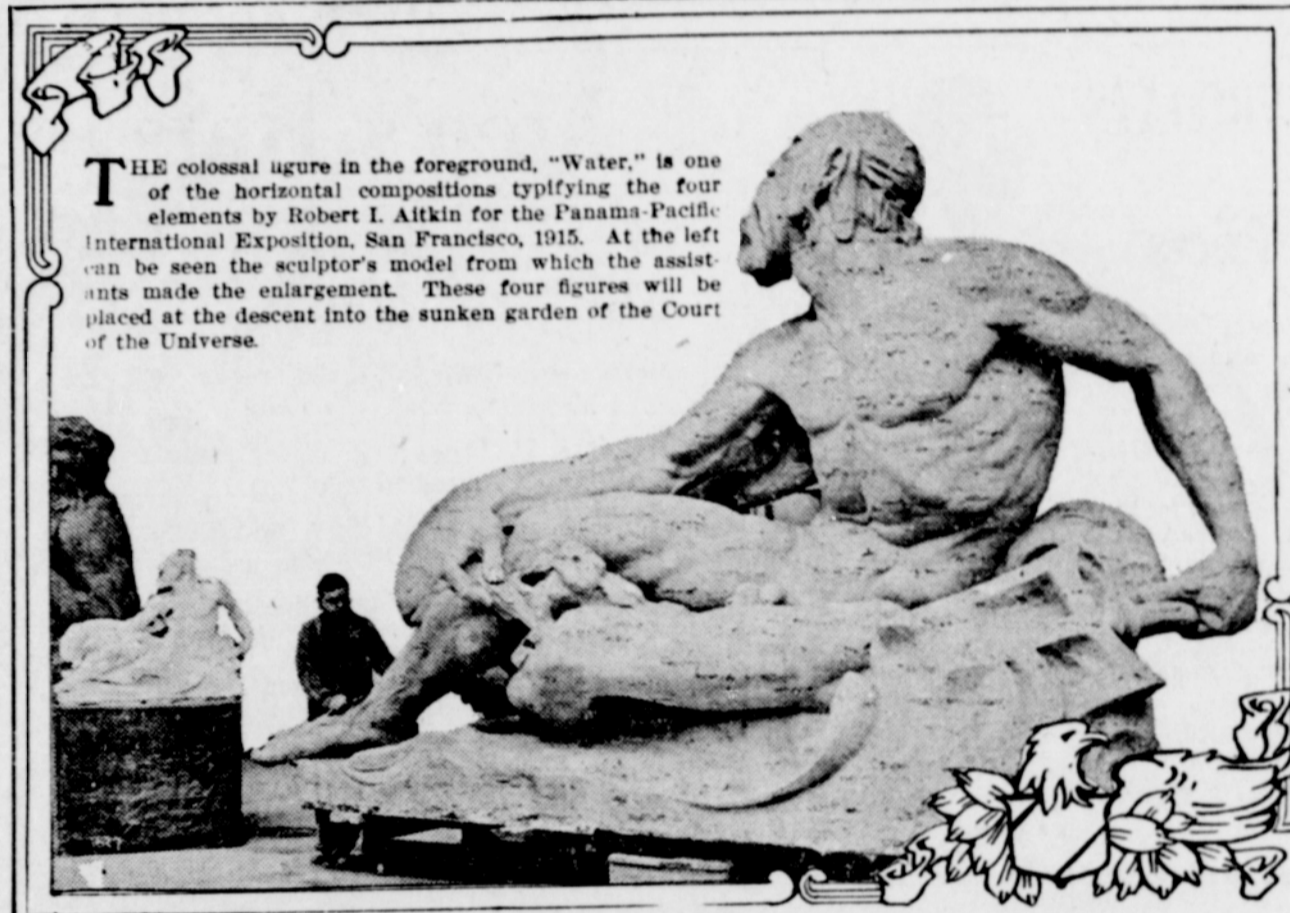

NAILING OLD GLORY TO MAST ABOVE GOLDEN GATE AT PANAMA-PACIFIC EXPOSITION.

THE photograph shows Miss Mary Elizabeth Payne, the vocalist of Missouri, raising the flag over the dome of the Palace of Manufactures, 160 feet from the ground. In the foreground is the ten acre area, with solid concrete walls, of the central Court of the Universe, which, when completed, will be the most beautiful plaza in the world.



THE colossal figure in the foreground, "Water," is one of the horizontal compositions typifying the four elements by Robert I. Aitkin for the Panama-Pacific International Exposition, San Francisco, 1915. At the left can be seen the sculptor's model from which the assistants made the enlargement. These four figures will be placed at the descent into the sunken garden of the Court of the Universe.

Exquisite Alcove In Court of the Four Seasons at World's Greatest Exposition



MONTHS in advance of its opening the Panama-Pacific International Exposition at San Francisco was 95 per cent completed. The photograph above shows a stately alcove in the Court of the Four Seasons, of which Henry Bacon, designer of the Lincoln memorial at Potomac Park, Washington, D. C., is the architect. In each of the four corners of the court are niches containing fountains and symbolizing the seasons—spring, summer, autumn and winter.
