County property tax drop box now available at City Hall

Deschutes County residents can drop off second trimester property tax payments at the county's new payment drop box at Redmond City Hall. The new drop box, which is located behind Redmond City Hall at 411 SW Ninth St., will be open during trimester property payment tax windows, which occur in late October to mid-November, late January to mid-February and late April to mid-May. "As we attempt to limit the exposure to and prevent the spread of COVID-19, our first priority remains the health, safety and security of our community," said Greg Munn, the

county's treasurer and chief financial officer, in a press release. "We hope this new location makes it easy for residents who live in northern Deschutes County to return their property tax payments." Payments can also be mailed, completed online or over the phone, or dropped off at the Bend drop box at the Deschutes Services Building, 1300 NW Wall Street. 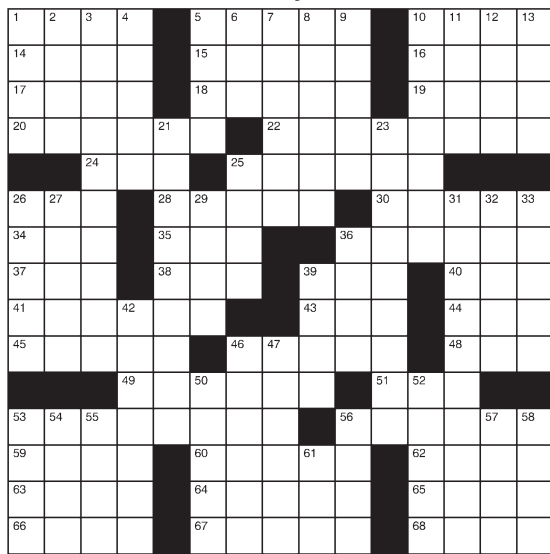
