Redmond School District looks to fill open seat

The Redmond School District is seeking qualified people to apply for a vacancy on its Board of Directors.

The board consists of five members elected at large. Those interested must be registered voters and residents of the Redmond School District for one year immediately preceding the appointment.

Applications will be accepted until 5 p.m. on June 13. An applicant will be appointed, or interviews will be scheduled the evening of June 22, 2022.

The person appointed will serve July 1 until June 30, 2023, and will fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Jill Cummings.

Anyone wishing to be elected to serve the remaining two-year portion of the four-year term may file an application with the Deschutes County Clerk's Office for placement on the May 2023 ballot.

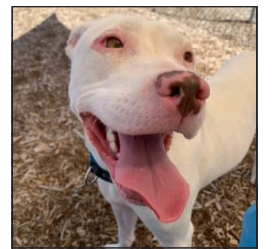

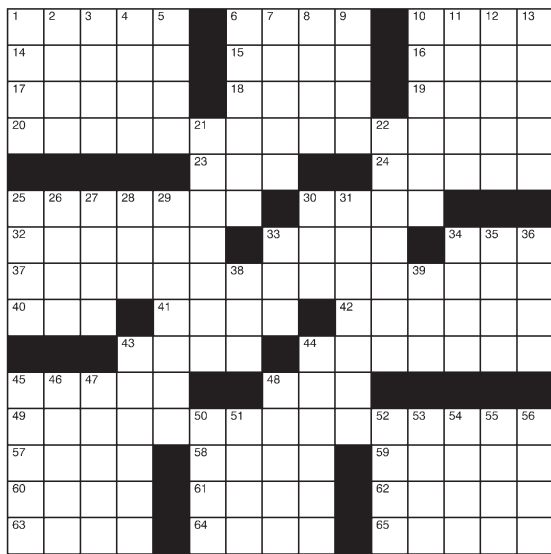
