Local runners excel in Dirty Half

Central Oregon runners dominated the Dirty Half Marathon, staged June 11 on a dirt-trail loop near Phil's Trailhead west of Bend.

Bend's Max King won the 13.1-mile men's race in 1 hour, 17 minutes, 31 seconds, boasting a 5:53-per-mile pace. Chase Parnell, also of Bend, finished second in 1:22:53, and Redmond's Evan Moreau took third in

ing a 6:23-per-mile pace. Amber Tookey, of Boise, Idaho, finished second among women in 1:33:10 and Bend's Kerri Lyons was third in 1:33:47.

The race included 180 women's finishers and 159 men's finishers.




