#### **100 YEARS AGO**

July 10, 1947 — Crews oiling state routes

#### **50 YEARS AGO**

**July 12, 1972 — National Guard unit depart for Idaho** 

Redmonds Company M, Third Squadron, 163rd Armored Cavalry, Oregon Army National Guard, will arrive at 13, for its annual two weeks of field training.

The 53-man unit will leave the main base at Gowen Field July 16 for the 166, 400-acre training site in the Idaho desert where it will undergo seven days of intensive troop tactical training, firing and testing.

Upon its return to the main base the unit will be doing cleanup and maintenance work until July 26. Company M, commanded by 1st Lt. Jalan VanNice, expects to improve its already high efficiency rating during this pe-

The unit will return to Redmond on July 27.

#### 25 YEARS AGO

**July 9, 1997 — Rimrock** development dies as session ends

The amended bill that would have cleared some obstacles for the proposed Rimrock resort was voted down in the state Legislature's chaotic closing rush.

The original version of the bill passed by the Senate was drastically altered in the house to win the support of Gov. John Kitzhaber, who had a hand in writing the amendments to SB870.

The revised version would

have let Rimrock developers apply for Deschutes County approval of their proposed \$500 million resort through the exemptions process, which allows consideration of proposed developments that don't meet all requirements of

the state land-use laws. The amended bill was defeated 38-19 when it came up for a vote in the house with no time for the debate shortly before the harried legislators had to end their Thursday night session.

Voting on the resort bill was rushed because the house also had to squeeze in voting on a charter schools bill. "The issue of destination resorts was just lost," said Sen. Neil Bryant (R-Bend), who sponsored the original

bill. "It should not have taken place that way."

Rep Ben Westlund (R-Bend) also was dismayed the resort bill was not discussed on the house floor before the vote.

"You give the issue an earring; that's what we are therefore," Westlund said.

Bryant noted the vote came after several grueling days as legislators worked long hours last week to finish their business before the holiday weekend.

"I think given normal circumstances, if there are normal circumstances at the end of a legislative session ... there would have been good debate and the bill had a chance" to pass on a close
