Aug. 30, 1972 — Sisters high school bond election set Sisters voters will decide Oct. 3

if they want to reopen Sisters High School next fall after several years of transporting their high school students to Redmond on a tuition basis.

The Sisters School Board Monday night decided to take a \$598,000 bond issue for construction of new high school facilities to the voters on Oct. 3. Superintendent Homer Kearns estimates that the proposed bond issue would increase taxes nearly \$5 per \$1,000 true cash value.

25 Years Ago

Aug. 27, 1997 — City requests second audit covering Falcon Cable fees The Redmond City Council is turning up the heat on Falcon Cable over

local cable TV service. Still awaiting an independent analysis of the company's compliance with service requirements, the city has asked for a second audit to assess Redmond franchise fee rates. Redmond cable rates are the highest in Central Oregon.

In addition, the city council on Sept. 23 will consider an ordinance to strengthen the city's "weak franchise agreement with Falcon," interim city manager Vergie Ries said in a letter to Ruby Sutherland, Falcon's Redmond operations manager.

On the same day, the city council will discuss a request from Falcon to transfer the local cable franchise to an affiliated partnership based in Delaware.

Mayor Jerry Thackery has requested that a "representative with decision-making authority" attend the Sept. 23 meeting. Counselors expect to see the results of the technical audit on franchise compliance prior to the meeting.

"We'll just see if they want to be a partner or not," said City Councilor Mike Newell.
