The term "órale" is a slang word in Mexican Spanish that Robles roughly translated to "right on."

Your first order should be: Robles recommended the quesabirria — a dish that is popular in Mexico but less known in Mexican-American cuisine. Órale!'s quesabirria is a hit, Robles said.
