Election District With One Voter.
From the Nineteenth election district in the Twentieth assembly district, New York, there came the other night the first complete returns. It was the first voting district to complete its count in the United States, and it went for Roosevelt by one vote, says the New York Herald. These are the returns, given five seconds after the polls closed:
Roosevelt, 1; Parker, 0; Higgins, 1; Herrick, 0.

This district is bounded by East Thirty-fifth and East Thirty-sixth streets, Second avenue and the East river and lies in the area cleared by the Pennsylvania Railroad company for its terminal. The one vote in the district was cast by a watchman who is the only remaining resident of the district. It was necessary to have the entire election machinery of the district there to enable him to vote.
