It costs the eastern woolen mills 20 per cent to sell the cloth, in discounts, freights and commissions, and the clothing houses figure on 10 per cent for the cost of deceased. seiling the clothing. In addition to this we have to add the freight on clothing being resurned to the Pacific Coast, making a total expense of 40 per cent for handling the wool to the
