The law to protect the forests of the state of Oregon is now in effect. It provides that a permit to build fires must be secured of the county clerk, the permit season being from June 1 to Oct. 1. The permit fixes the time for setting out fire on three consecutive days named therein, and not less than ten days from the date of such permit, and at no time when the wind makes it probable that the fire will get beyond control. During the close season locomotives, logging, traction or any spark emitting engines located in timber districts must be provided with spark arresters. Campers and other's building fires and leaving them before totally extinguished are liable to a fine of \$100. Should damage result from fires negligently set the law provides for fines from \$10 to \$1000.
