Woolen Mills for Stayton. Special

To Be Built Soon as Possible.

Buildings to Be Commenced at Once.

Arrangements are being made to commence the buildings for the Stayton woolen mills as soon as possible. Plans are now being prepared and as soon as ready men will be started to work at once. Contracts for quarrying the stone are now being given, and the work will be rushed through with all possible speed. The buildings will be located on the Whitney property northeast of Gardner's mill and will be of stone. The main building will be 60x120, two and one-half stories high. The upper floor of this building will be used in the manufacture of clothing, the second floor will contain the carding and spinning department, and the first the weaving and finishing. Another building, 50x60, also of stone, will be built 50 feet distant from the main building. This will contain the drying and picking departments. The automatic sprinkler system will be installed, which will reduce the cost of insurance 2 per cent. As the plant will carry about \$75,000 insurance, this will be a saving of \$1,500 per year. The mills will make a specialty of ready made pants, flannel shirts, flannel underwear and mackinaw clothing.

Stayton is very fortunate to secure this industry. It will be the making of our town. When the mill is complete the company will employ 100 hands with a pay roll of \$4,000 per month. Our population will greatly increase. Now that we are started let us make a special effort to bring here other factories to use up our hundreds of horse power running to waste. Let outsiders know our advantages and they will come here. Let everybody give the town a boost. Knock the knockers and see the town grow. As a location for factories Stayton has no equal.

Since the work on the interior of the Brewer drug store has been thus far completed, it presents a handsome appearance. The walls have been covered with a neat design of linocut, new shelving finished in the natural color of the wood has been put in, new linoleum covers the floor, and the entire store room presents a much improved appearance. New show cases reaching to the floor have been ordered and will soon be in. When everything is in place this will be as handsome a store room as may be found in the county.
