They are receiving a good supply of milk and making some fine cheese. Mr. Witschi, the cheese maker, learned the business in Switzerland, where cheese making is a leading industry. They are now making only American cheese, brick and limburger, but later in the year will make other kinds.

New Corporations.

Three companies filed articles of incorporation at Salem June 30th, all of which point to the future development of the upper Santiam Valley. They were the Pittock & Leadbetter Co., H. L. Pittock, H. M. Cate and F. W. Leadbetter. Capital stock, \$100,000 object, ownership and dedication of townsites; ownership and operation of transportation lines, telegraph and telephone lines, electric light plants, water rights and powers, etc.

The Santiam Electric Co., W. P. Hawley, H. L. Pittock, J. N. Healey and F. W. Leadbetter. Capital stock, \$20,000; object, to furnish water from the Santiam river and other streams for irrigation, power etc. The Columbia River Pulp and Paper Co., H. L. Pittock, F. W. Leadbetter and W. P. Hawley. Capital, \$100,000; object to operate paper mills, saw mills and other industries relating thereto.

W. P. Hawley whose name appears in each of the above corporations has for several years been purchasing land and water rights along the Santiam, and is now said to be the owner of the mason work done by the O'Neils at Niagara. H. L. Pittock is one of the owners of the Oregonian, and is reported a millionaire.

From all appearances, the north Santiam will soon be furnishing power for various industries.
