SANTIAM RIVER.

The following appeared last week in the special edition, but not in the part sent to subscribers, hence we reproduce it.

One of the most beautiful streams imaginable is the Santiam river, flowing along the southern boundary of Stayton and dividing Marion and Linn counties.

As a water power stream it is unsurpassed. A survey made by the University of Oregon between Detroit and Mill City shows that the total fall of the river between these two places, a distance of 24 miles, is nearly 900 feet. This shows that the total energy of the stream for the 24 miles is the equivalent in round numbers of 175,000 horse power continuously exerted. A number of plants could be put in varying from 5,000 to 10,000 horse power each. Between Mill City and Stayton there are also a number of good power sites.

But it is not of the utility of the stream but its beauty that this article expects to treat.

Taking its source amid the melting snows of Mt. Jefferson, it is joined by numerous tributaries before uniting itself with the Willamette near Jefferson.

Let us take the Corvallis & Eastern R. R. for a trip up the Santiam. Crossing the river on the large bridge at Stayton (if it is a nice day we walk), we catch the train at Kingston. After boarding the train we get our first view of the river from the cars at Kephart Bluff—a beautiful scene. We then ride through a splendid farming country for several miles before we meet the river again at Mill City, where its power runs a big saw mill employing 150 or more men the year round. From here on to Detroit, the end of the railroad, we are in sight of the river most of the time—sometimes so close that fish may be seen in the crystal clear waters.

At Niagara there is an immense masonry work built at a gorge in the river to be used some day as a source of great power. From here on the scenery becomes beautiful in the extreme—towering crags, fir covered mountain sides, deep canyons through which the stream fights its way over huge boulders and occasional jams of driftwood, quiet pools where trout love to lie, foaming rapids, and other beauties of which one never tires.

For some time we have been passing through logging camps, frequently a well-built farm house is passed—for there is good farming country up the valley—an occasional village, and, crossing the Beitenbush, a tributary of the Santiam, Detroit is reached. We are now in the mountains. From here distant twenty miles east is Marion lake, reached only by a trail.

Sixteen miles northeast is the Breitenbush hot springs, a great summer resort. The springs have wonderful medicinal faculties. The water comes from the rocks in a boiling condition. One of them is called the cooking spring. A pail of beans set in this spring in the evening will be found nicely boiled in the morning. The waters of the springs are pleasant to the taste, and are valuable in stomach trouble and dyspepsia; also for rheumatism. They are also antagonistic to tobacco, and many people have gone there and returned cured of the tobacco habit.

The scenery along the trail to the hot springs is most beautiful—words are inadequate to describe the charm of the scenery of this mountain resort.

But we have traveled farther than we intended. After an excellent dinner at the Detroit Hotel, we get aboard the cars again, the train picks up several cars of logs enroute to Mill City, and enjoying the scenery every bit of the return trip, we are soon at home again.

Condor Individuality.

We had the best chance of studying the colors of the condor head. The bill was horn color, and the red skin of the head extended down, covering it about halfway. On the breast of each bird the skin was blood red and could be seen occasionally when the breast feathers were spread and the birds were preening. Both had light colored wing bars, and the primaries were well worn. The skin on the throat hung loose, and the lower mandible fitted close under the upper. The chin was orange red, and below this on the neck was a strip of greenish yellow merging into the orange about the sides and back of the neck. The top and front of the head were red, but between the eyes was a small patch of black feathers, and these extended down in front of the eye into the orange red of the cheek. The pupil of the eye was black, but the iris was deep and red and conspicuous. The bald and wrinkled pate, the flabby jaws, with the cave-in expression of a toothless old woman—these helped to make up the condor individuality.—William L. Finley in Century.
