ELECTRIC RAILROADS

Network to Be Built in Willamette Valley.

Ten Million Dollars to Be Expended by Oregon Electric.

Portland, April 23.—The capitalization of the Oregon Electric Co. has been increased to \$10,000,000 and the company begins to-day on a network of electric lines to cover the Willamette valley. The first work will be done on the line from Portland to Hillsboro. Next the line from Salem to Albany.

At a meeting of the directors of the company the following new lines were authorized: Salem to Albany, 18 miles; Garden Home to Hillsboro, 12 miles; Hillsboro to Tillamook, 57 miles; Albany to Eugene; Salem to Mill City, 54 miles; Albany to Cascadia, 35 miles. This company owns the line now running between Portland and Salem.

The revised articles of incorporation have been sent to Salem for filing with the Secretary of State.

Moffatt & White, 5 Nassau street, New York, are managers of the syndicate that is supplying the capital for the Oregon Electric operations in this state. In a general way the extensions of the Oregon Electric's system will provide widely separated parallel lines up the Willamette valley from Portland, one on each side of the river, together with a main line running to the coast at Tillamook and a number of feeders and laterals throughout the territory reached. From the Portland-Salem line a road will be built through Washington and Tillamook counties to Hillsboro and Tillamook bay. This line will tap one of the richest dairy and farming sections on the Pacific coast.

From Tigardville, also on the Portland-Salem line, a main trunk road will be built through Washington, Yamhill, Polk, Benton and Lane counties, through Corvallis to Eugene. Another line will be built from Dallas to Salem and then easterly through Marion county to Mill City. There also will be a road constructed from Albany, which will be reached by an extension of the main line from Salem, southeast through Lebanon to Cascadia.
