Ida Grove, Iowa, March 27.—A great sensation was created here when between sixty and seventy farmers in Ida county received notice from the United States circuit court of appeal to the effect that the so-called Economy cream separator they had purchased of Sears, Roebuck & Company had been declared an infringement and they were restrained from using the separator. The farmers who have received notice have consulted lawyers

as to what they had better do and the lawyers advised them to break up and sell the old separators as old iron and then come up town and buy new ones. The mail order house has been restrained by the court from manufacturing and selling any more of the separators and they were also forced to bring their books into court and show to whom they had sold machines. The users are now being notified that they must not use them. The separator was an infringement on a New Jersey make.

Several persons near Stayton have been caught by this same deal. How the matter will be adjusted we have not yet learned.

Lewis Bros. & Co., the largest Sales Co. in the United States and Canada, have secured the stock of B. Prange, of Sublimity. This Saturday they will start selling out. The price of every article has been marked very low, as the stock must be closed out in 10 days to meet the demands of creditors. Look for the big red sign.

## The Number Fourteen in France.

So far as France is concerned, it is the number fourteen that has played a conspicuous and generally portentous part in her history. On May 14, 1554, the Rue de la Ferronnerie was enlarged by order of Henri II., and four times fourteen years later Henri IV. was assassinated there by Ravallac—namely, on May 14, 1610. Henri had lived four times fourteen years, fourteen weeks and four times fourteen days—i. e., fifty-six years and five months. Then Henri's son, Louis XIII., died May 14, 1643 (the same day and month as his father's). And 1643 added together equals fourteen, just as 1553 (the year of the birth of Henri IV.) equals fourteen. Louis XIV ascended the throne 1643, which added together equals fourteen and similarly the year of his death (1715) equals.
