## Public School Matters.

The call for a citizens meeting to discuss school matters, Monday night, the 11th, brought out a fair-sized gathering of people, and various opinions were expressed in regard to a new school building and an addition to the present one; the Union High School was also considered. The majority of those present were in favor of the Board raising the money to build new school quarters.

Notices have been posted by the board calling a meeting Monday, June 1st, for the purpose of voting on the question of bonding the district for \$4,000, the money to be used in building an addition to the school house and repairing the present building, which is badly in need of new floors in some rooms, as well as other repairs.

The school badly needs more room, and it is the opinion of the Board, as well as a great many of the tax-payers, that the best thing to do at present is to build an addition to the school building, on the west side, with a basement and that the entire building be heated by a furnace, and properly ventilated. It is thought that such a building will do Stayton for four or five years. At the end of that period, if the town continues its present growth, a new building will be necessary, and there will be many more people here to assist in building it. If the town doesn't grow, we will not be obliged to build a new house, and will not be burdened with a heavy debt.

The matter of \$4000 bonds will add very little to the taxes of the average tax-payer, and the fact of having a good school will greatly enhance the value of all the property in the district.

Judge Scott on Monday rendered a decision nullifying the petition of Sublimity and Stayton for a separate vote of these two precincts on the local option question, and submitting the petition calling for a vote on the question and uniting the precincts of Jefferson, Marion, Macleay, Aumsville, Stayton, Sublimity and Turner. The uniting of these precincts is pretty sure to "dry" the whole number. All but Sublimity and Stayton have been dry, and the fact that it is generally believed Stayton will give a dry majority next month, is pretty sure to work a hardship on the saloons. Many people are of the opinion that had Stayton and Sublimity been voted together, that these precincts would have gone dry. The growth of sentiment toward a dry town has been growing fast in both precincts during the past two years, particularly in Stayton. Here many who voted wet two years ago declare their intention to vote dry. The way some of the Stayton saloons have been conducted during this time has convinced them that this is the proper course to pursue.

The 36th annual re-union of the Oregon Pioneer Association will be held in Portland, Oregon, June 11th. The annual business meeting of Indian War Veterans will be held June 10th. Reduced rates will be given on railroads to Pioneers.

Several from here attended the Leap year dance at Sublimity Tuesday night, and report a very pleasant time. The dance was given by Mr. Prange's sales-ladies.

Work has commenced on the foundation of E. Roy's new two-story cement stone building.

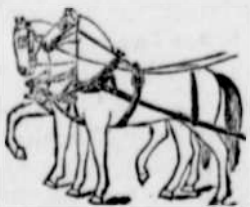
