

Hunkadora Ticket.

Following is the platform adopted by the Hunkadoras of Marion County Convention, at Mehama, at its recent convocation:

WHEREAS, the Hunkadora party for two years had the political thought of that portion of Marion county east of Turner and the Narrow Gauge Railroad and

WHEREAS, this great party has succeeded the last two years by being aggressive and fearless in the support of right men wrong, and we the Hunkadoras of Marion county and state of Oregon, in convention assembled, mindful of the glories which cluster around its two years past history, renew our pledges to the doctrines which have received the endorsement of the people of this portion of the county, and do make and affirm the following declarations of our political principals:

1st. That we favor honest, efficient and economic administration of every department of Marion county and State of Oregon.

2nd. That we favor high labor and plenty of capital to back it up.

3rd. That we regard the free school system in this part of Marion county a farce, without increased rate bills to help keep a three months school once a year.

4th. To encourage the manufacturing interest along the North Santiam river and its tributaries to Smith's ferry at Mehama.

5th. That we reaffirm the policy of the Hunkadora party to foster and encourage railroads from East Hoggan via Sublimity, Stayton and Mehama and intersect the Narrow Gauge at Scio.

6th. That we demand appropriation of the Scotch Company for the purpose of cleaning out Mill Creek from Stayton to Salem, in order that we

have free transportation from Stayton to the deep water in the Willamette river at Salem and connect us with all the harbors between Salem, Portland and Victoria.

7th. That all lands that the Democratic Congress has taken away from railroads and wagon road corporations should, be restored to them by said corporations paying to the Government four dollars per acre.

8th. We denounce the Mortgage Tax Law, for the reason each country will get her own taxes, and Multnomah county and Tillamook will be cut out of all the taxes of the various counties in the State.

9th. We renew our declarations in favor of the importation of Chinese from British Columbia to the State of Oregon and Washington Territory and into the Capital and Coeur d'Alene mines.

10th. That we are strictly in favor of a registry law in the cities east of Turner Station namely, Hoggan, Sublimity, Stayton and Mehama and Scio as to give the women a right to vote first and the people next.

11th. That we are in favor of Women Suffrage and the Fifteenth Amendment; also the Reconstruction Act and the State Fair at Salem.

12th. That we favor the Prohibition movement and the Blue Ribbon Club in our midst.

13th. That we ask our Legislators, if elected, to appropriate sufficient amount of Funds for a fish ladder to be erected at McFerrin Falls on the Santiam, in Kings Prairie in order that salmon may pass into fresh water.

14th. We denounce and ask for the repeal of the game and bird law, for the reason that every body is guilty and you can't convict.
