C T Rogers Here As Well As His Son C E Rogers.

As there had been a meeting called for Thursday last for the purpose of hearing the report of special committee on Milk Condenser, Messrs C. T. Rogers and son. C. E. Rogers of Detroit Michigan arrived in town the day before. C. T. Rogers is a pioneer in the manufacturing of milk condenser machinery, his son too is in the same business but neither have any business connection with the other.

C. T. Rogers is making plans for a plant to be put in at Ishaquia, Washington, the same plans fit this locality very closely, in fact we could do no mistake in following very closely the plans and specifications shown.

Some of our people have asked who was going to furnish the machinery for the Milk Condenser, this matter is to be left with the stock subscribers, for they are to choose their own officers who will have charge of the affairs. No outside party is to have the control or handling of the business.
