### HOP VINES UTILIZED

A use for hop vines left in the field after the crop is picked has been found by an experimenter at Tacoma, Wash. He proposes to utilize the fiber in much the same way that flax is used. A chemical is used to dissolve the vegetable matter that encloses the fiber and the latter is then ready to be dried, carded, spun and made into cloth. Practically the same treatment and machinery can be used as in flax manufacture.

### SHETLAND PONY FREE

It will be awarded to the boy or girl making the best exhibit of livestock and is offered by the Portland Union Stockyards Company.
