EFFORTS MADE LAST SEASON A SUCCESS

At the annual convention of the Oregon State Bankers' Association, held recently at Corvallis, the progress made in agricultural development and education during the past year was carefully reviewed. Reports from all over the state indicate that the effort made last season to interest the school children, as well as their parents, had met with remarkable success, enabling the association to hold fairs in every county in the state except two at which the Wonder Land contains many of the various articles made and the products grown by the children were exhibited. At these county gatherings the finest specimens were selected and forwardel children were awarded prizes in an

amount aggregating \$20,000. SERVE LANDS AND SOIL

The Forest Service department has recently taken up the work of reclassification of lands in the national forest reserves with a view to opening up for settlement such agricultural lands as may now be included within the reserve boundaries. Under the plan for this work the bureau of of soils will determine what soils are agricultural in character, experts of the forest service will determine whether or not the value of the timber or such lands is greater than the agricultural valuation, and if not, any lands which are found valu-92.75 able for agricultural and not needed for 107.25 public purposes will be immediately opened to settlement and entry under \$ 285.95 the homestead laws.
