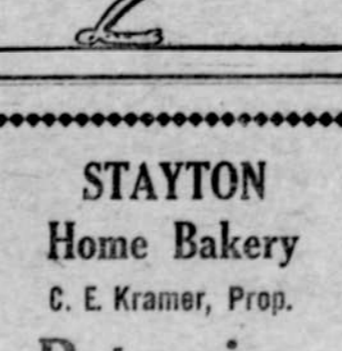
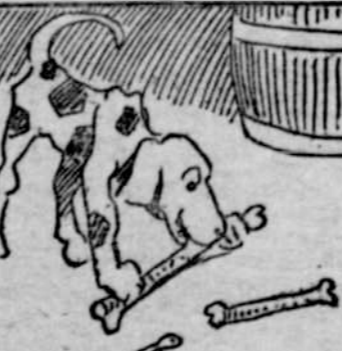

To Mary E. Schell, Lousia J. Smith and Jerome Mulkey, defendants, IN THE NAME OF THE STATE OF OREGON you are hereby required to appear and answer a complaint filed against you in the above entitled court and cause, on or before the 7th day of January, 1915, said date being six (6) weeks from the date ordered for the first publication of this summons, to-wit: November 26th, 1914 and if you fail so to appear and answer said complaint, plaintiff will apply to the court for the relief demanded in said complaint, namely, for a decree for the partitioning of the following described lands, to-wit: Beginning at a point on the north boundary line of the Donation Land Claim of David Mulkey and wife in Township 9, South range 1, East of the Willamette Meridian in Marion County, State of Oregon, said point being north 84 deg. 23 min. east 13.86 chains from the most westerly north-west corner of said claim and being at the most northerly north-east corner of a tract of land owned by E. D. Alexander, as shown of record in Volume 104 at page 368 of Records of Deeds for Marion County Oregon, running thence north 84 deg. 32 min. east 14.16 chains more or less to a point within 11.88 chains of the south-east corner of the James Valentine claim, thence north 8 deg. 30 min. east 27.70 chains to the center of the county road leading from Mehama to Stayton, thence easterly following the center line of said road to the north-west corner of a 50-acre tract of land owned by C.
