Oysters.

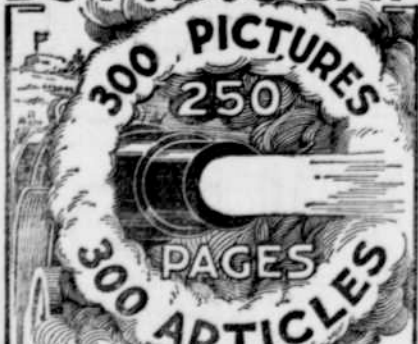
When in their natural condition oysters contain from one-eighth to one-fifth more nutritive material than when fattened. Speaking roughly, a quart of oysters contains on an average about the same quantity of actual nutritive substance as a quart of milk or three-fourths of a pound of beef, or two pounds of fresh codfish, or a pound of bread. Oysters come nearer to milk than almost any other common food material as regards both the amounts and the relative proportions of nutrients.

Almost a Mushroom City.

Calro is almost a mushroom city, according to the standards of Egypt and the east. It is not yet 1,000 years old. But it had predecessors very nearly upon the same spot. There was the Roman stronghold known as Babylon of Egypt, or even as Babylon simply. To this in the seventh century A. D. succeeded Fustat, named, it is said, after its founder's skin tent, for which this is Arabic, and the name of Fustat survives today in "fustian," which was formerly made there. Finally came the new city of Mas-el-Kahira (the victorious), which Europeans now call Cairo, while the natives, preferring the other part of the word, call it Masr.—London Chronicle.

The Sardonian Smile.

The expression "sardonian smile" is as old as Homer. It means literally to "grin like a dog" and bears reference to the hideous contortion of the facial muscles produced by eating the sardonian, a plant of Sicily, which was said to screw up the face of the eater, giving it a horrible appearance. Mahan, in his history of England, says: "The island of Sardinia, consisting chiefly of marshes or of mountains, has from the earliest period to the present been cursed with a noxious air, an ill cultivated soil and a scanty population. The convulsions produced by its poisonous plants gave rise to the expression of 'sardonian smile,' which is as old as Homer."
