Mr. and Mrs. F. M. Fresh called at the A. Burns home Sunday afternoon.

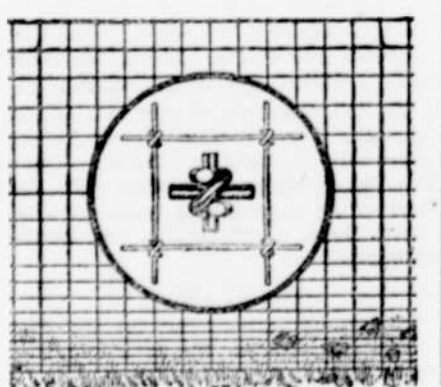
