SUPT. CHURCHILL VISITS STAYTON SCHOOL

State Supt. of Public Instruction, J. A. Churchill, accompanied by County Supt. W. M. Smith, as stated in last week's Mail visited the school here Thursday and gave a thorough examination of the building, equipment, methods and courses of study. In an interview with Mr. Churchill that afternoon, he stated to a representative of the Mail that beyond a doubt, Stayton had a school second to none in the state, compared with any town its size, or much larger. He also complimented the board on the arrangement of the building, the completeness of the equipment and library, and the teachers on the methods being used and the spirit of the school in general. Mr. Churchill and Mr. Smith left for Salem in the late afternoon after a pleasant day spent in the Stayton schools.

SAW MILL BURNS

Nealen & Metzger's saw mill near Lyons, burned to the ground early Saturday morning. The fire started about half past two, and is supposed to have originated from a spark or a creeping fire from the sawdust pile. Besides the mill, about \$2,000 worth of seasoned lumber was destroyed. The total loss was in the neighborhood of \$4,000, with no insurance.
