FOR DISTRICT ATTORNEY



WALTER E. KEYES

I am a candidate for the office of District Attorney at the primary election to be held the 19th day of May, 1916.

I was born and raised on a stock ranch in Eastern Oregon; I am thirty-five years of age and was educated for the most part in the city of Salem, where I have been engaged exclusively in the practice of law for the past ten years.

I assume there are two propositions paramount in the mind of every voter in selecting a candidate for this important office.

First: The honor and integrity of the man who seeks the place.

Second: His ability to fill the position if elected.

As to the first proposition, I think it is universally admitted that honor and integrity constitute man's most noble assets, regardless of whether he leads that of a public or private life.

It would be far from becoming however, for me to state that I possess either of these two important virtues, I shall therefore only refer you to my many friends in Marion County in order that you may determine for yourself whether or not I measure up to the standard in this respect.

In a consideration of the second proposition I realize that the office of district attorney demands a person who has had actual experience in the trial of cases. In this connection however, I desire to state that I am not without experience in the prosecution of criminal cases as I have handled many cases of this character both for the County of Marion and for the city of Salem.

I have never held an elective office, but served as special prosecutor in a number of cases for J. H. McNary while he was district attorney and served as a deputy under Gale S. Hill during his tenure of office. For two different terms I was appointed by the common council as attorney for the City of Salem. It was during my tenure of office as city attorney that much of the hard pavement was laid in the city of Salem. I am very thankful to be able to say that while I was city attorney no liens were placed upon the city docket for the construction of streets, sewers or sidewalks, but what were held valid, and that of many liens which were contested in the courts, every case was decided in favor of the city.

The duties of district attorney consist chiefly in the preparation and trial of cases and a discrimination against family quarrels and frivolous prosecutions. I believe that the laws of our State should be enforced. This is society's only protection. But I do not believe the docket should be crowded at the expense of the taxpayers with cases where convictions cannot be procured. Nothing is gained in arranging men before a court of justice only to have them discharged on account of insufficiency of evidence. What property I own, I have earned from the efforts of my own toil, and therefore appreciate that every officer should endeavor to operate with the least expense possible to effectively accomplish results.

If the people of Marion County repose in me the confidence of this office, I shall at all times perform my duties in accordance with my oath, and shall treat the public with due and courteous consideration.
