Hood River has a candy and glace apple factory.

Stanfield, Alfalfa ranch sells for \$250 per acre.

Canyon City. Flour mill planned here.

Bend is shipping potatoes east.

Roseburg, Pacific Tel. & Tel. Co. to spend \$5,320 on new cable between here and Edenbower.

1500 ship carpenters on Willamette & Columbia receive increase in pay.
