Industrial Activity Giving Employment to Thousands in Oregon. Outside Money Developing Enterprise. By Conservative Legislation Encourage Investment of Capital Here.

Eugene, Aggregate tax levy is 18.75 mills for county and 42.9 mills for city.

Springfield dedicated \$35,000 Methodist church and parsonage. Portland merchants made an excursion the past week to investigate the flax industry now being developed in the Willamette Valley.

Salem, bill prepared for teacher's retirement fund. Five per cent of salary to be set aside for term of years, when state is to add \$2,000.

Under municipal ownership, Eugene water board adds two mill tax levy.

Oak Grove, Clackamas county, votes ten mill tax for paved highway.

Klamath Falls, work started on new Baptist church.

New State Boards and Commissions proposed are Fire Warden, Board of Charities and board for wayward children. There will be others.

Salem, Northwest Fruit Products Co. has used 1000 tons cull apples making sparkling beverages.

From the standpoint of new industrial development the west needs two things from Congress, workable waterpower legislation such as is proposed under either the Shields bill or the Ferris bill as amended in the Senate and relief for innocent oil operators on withdrawn lands.

Canyon City, fox breeding for fur trade to be new industry here. P. A. Snyder investing \$10,000.

Washington county budget \$9000 less than last year.

Applegate, dry land dredges being installed here to work placer ground.

At Grants Pass the I. W. W. outfit was thrown out of the sugar beet factory. Grants Pass has had the factory long enough to be able to distinguish sugar beets from dead beets.—Gazette Times, Corvallis.

Gresham, Cannerymen decide to rebuild burned packing plant here.

Wasco county advertising for sale \$260,000 road bond recently voted.

Flax mills and a linen factory for western Oregon is the campaign now under way.

Oregon City, Moose will erect \$20,000 hall.

Portland, first of a series of ships launched by Peninsula Shipbuilding company.

Southerlin, Douglas Co. turkey raisers sold about 12,500 birds for approximately \$37,500.

Riddle will ship thirty carloads of broccoli this season.

Springfield, Waterville potato, raiser sells 5 acre crop for \$1,000 besides saving enough seed for 6 acres and feeding part of crop to 2 families and 6 hogs.

Grants Pass, Utah-Idaho Sugar Co. voluntarily raises contract price of beets from \$6 to \$7. The extreme advance is due to good sugar prices caused by war conditions.

That the state still is a sovereign power over municipalities and that the Public Service Commission of Oregon may regulate rates in municipalities by the exercise of police power regardless of contractual agreement between a municipality and a public service corporation, is the hold is a recent opinion of the Supreme Court.

Monroe potato industry gets uplift from sale of twenty carloads of early white rose for seed at \$1.85 per 100 lbs.

Portland Journal is advocating a state board of Charities.

Bend sells \$35,000 to Denver firm in raising money for Strathorn road.

The dairy industry does not need more laws and official regulation so much as more cow-milkers and an abundance of competent farm labor at prices at which the farmers can afford to hire them.

A. H. Buck to install shingle mill on Siuslaw.

Marshfield, Coos Bay railroad Co. incorporates for \$5000 to build and operate a railroad in Coos County.
