## OREGON INDUSTRIAL REVIEW

Industrial Items Show Heavy Expenditures Under way or Contemplated and New Industries Started. Conservative Legislation and Fight for Lower Taxes Encourages Investors.

Astoria—227 tons rock to be laid along north jetty in next 90 days.

Klamath Falls to build 20 miles municipal railroad this spring.

Gearheart—number of new buildings going up here.

Corvallis has authorized bids for \$35,000 school building.

Hillsboro—movement started for Washington county union high school.

Pacific Coast Steel Co. planning a large plant at Willbridge.

Pendleton Elks will build a business block and club rooms in 1917.

McMinville gets two new brick business buildings.

Enterprise—\$60,000 school building proposed here.

Gold Hill—Long idle planing mill opens here.

Astoria—250 foot Auxiliary schooner Margaret launched at Andersen yards.

Portland—Portland Pure Milk and Cream Co. and Damascus Creamery combine and will erect new plant, making one of largest concerns in west.

Interstate Commerce Commission holds S. P. Co. can operate steamship lines to New Orleans and Galveston.

Columbia bridge will be furnished with \$30,000 surplus cash. P. R. L. & P Co. paying street car tolls at \$265 a day.

Ontario—new lighting system being constructed by the Idaho Power Co.

Hanes to have a modern cheese factory for North Powder valley.

Nysa Milling Co. has received machinery and plant soon to operate.

Marshfield—Scandinavian-American bank will erect a new building.

Florence—Delta Shingle Co. erects a \$20,000 plant.

Stayton—C. E. Daugherty consolidates Mail and Standard newspapers.

Vale—Sagehen nitrate claims consolidated by Juniper springs company.

Gresham—legislation makes it possible to improve Columbia slough.

Congress, as a prepared measure, should encourage, instead of discourage the development of our waterpower construction and operation of railroads, oil production, mining etc.

Bandon wants a roller mill to crush oats and barley for feed. This town put up subsidy for shipyard and would open woolen mill.

Estacada votes \$25,000 for high school.

Tillamook has 23 cheese factories and output for 1916 was \$807,095.

Marshfield—Smith lumber company increases wages at its plants.

Newberg gets garage 50 by 104 feet.

Yoncalla—famous Todd quicksilver mines eight miles from here opened.

Winchester water company installing big pump to supply S. P. Co.

Appropriation has been made by the state for an armory at Marshfield.

Pendleton to get a new garage one hundred feet square.

Freewater—Walla Walla firm has purchased cannery and will operate it with a pack of at least five hundred tons vegetables.

Inducements are being made to the farmers near Independence to raise sugar beets. This will necessitate the installation of irrigation equipment, which may be served electrically by the Oregon Power Co.

Stayton—Brown-Petzel sawmill erecting fine office building.

Pacific Telephone Co. building new 25 mile line Cushman to Gardner.

Astoria—Deep sea fishing Co. incorporates here will represent investment of \$100,000.
