OREGON INDUSTRIAL REVIEW

Industrial Records for past Week Show Marked Activity in all Parts of State. Fight Against Freak Legislation and for Lower Taxes Encourages Investments.

Independence—Farmers and citizens here working to secure sugar factory.

Coos Bay—Standard Oil Co. plans \$80,000 expenditure for storage tanks and equipment here to handle this territory.

Corvallis—Southern Pacific Co. wishes to make \$60,000 improvement here—franchise pending.

Marshfield—100,000 ton coal order bid on by local mine operator.

Port Orford—40 pounds of ambergris found on beach, part sold at \$14.00 an ounce.

Eugene—Machinery shipped for shingle mill on North Siuslaw.

Sublimity to have cheese factory.

McKenzie pass over Cascades to be first road improved connecting eastern and western Oregon.

Marshfield—S. P. Co. to put in steel draw bridge at Coal Bank Inlet, Relaying Myrtle point line with 80 pound steel.

The railroads are asking regulation at the hands of one national board instead of 48 state and federal boards as at present and a no good reason has been advanced against it. If the railroads would fight the move it would probably be forced upon them at once.

Portland and Corvallis are talking municipal Light & Power plant. Their taxes are not as high as in public ownership cities like Seattle and Eugene.

Sodaville—Eugene man to build hotel here.

Oregon City—\$10,000 hospital to be erected here.

Roseburg—\$22,500 hospital to be erected here.

Florence—Portland & Eugene men interested in shipyard here.

Federal commission to investigate power site on Columbia river for government nitrate plant.

Pendleton—North Main St. to be improved with 18 foot bitulithic drive at cost of \$86,000.

Salem—Oregon Packing Co. will surpass 200 carload output of 1916.

Eugene—Philadelphia firm offers \$840 a ton for long flax fibre.

Albany has plans for a cannery to operate this year.

Aurora—Oregon Electric exp. \$65,000 on treated to bridge across Willamette.

Gompers and Morrison of the American Federation of Labor read the riot act to the Supreme court for its decision in the Adamson law where it says the right of trainmen to precipitate a general strike is limited by the public interest.

Grants Pass—Encouraged by large returns to be made through growing beets, hopgrowers in this district are digging out hopyards and will plant.

Roseburg—S. P. Co. has cut car shortage from 2837 cars needed Nov. 25th to 445 cars on March 22nd.

Hood River has a movement for a public market.

McMinnville has voted \$90,000 bonds to improve city works.

Ashland to Klamath Falls highway to be built by state.

Medford—Sale of Blue Ledge Mine for \$750,000 to Salt Lake capitalists reported.

Baker—Idaho Power Co. plants file mortgage for \$18,846,000.

Portland—Gambrius Brewery plant to be utilized by large milk, cream and butter syndicate.

Ashland gets ice and cold storage plant with 10,000,000 lbs. capacity.

Shedd—Cascade Contract Co. putting in big ballast plant for crushed rock at Saddle Butte, two and one half miles from here.

Dufur—Farmers organize to build \$20,000 grain warehouse.

Grants Pass—Utah Idaho Sugar Co. will use 400,000 feet lumber building beet-loading stations in this valley. Acreage will be four time that planted in 1916.

State Highway Engineer has plans for three wooden lift bridges for Coos county, and a concrete arch bridge at Moody over Des Chutes.

Oregon City—Government engineers will resume their annual Summer diversion of "fixing up the locks and canal."

Eugene—Fruit growers to build addition to association building.

Our industrial development, including farms, mines, railroad etc. is being severely retarded due to the false conservation policy of congress in refusing to pass legislation allowing development of waterpower requiring federal permit. How much longer will the west have to put up with this situation?

Linnton—Contract let for \$180,923 to finish highway to Columbia county line in bitulithic.
