

Saves Eggs

Sponge Cake
 1 cup sugar
 1/2 cup water
 2 eggs

 1 cup flour

Directions.—Beat sugar and water until syrup spins a thread and add to the stiffly beaten whites of eggs, beating until the mixture is solid. Sift together three times the flour, salt and baking powder; beat yolks of eggs until thick; add a little at a time flour mixture and egg yolks alternately to white of egg mixture, stirring after each addition. Add 1/4 cup cold water and flavoring. Mix lightly and bake in moderate oven one hour.

The old method called for 6 eggs and no baking powder
