In the name of the State of Oregon: You are hereby required to appear and answer the complaint filed against you in the above entitled Court and cause on or before six weeks from the date of the first publication of this summons, and if you fail to so answer, for want thereof, the plaintiff will apply to the Court for the relief prayed for in his complaint, to-wit: That a certain mortgage executed by the above named defendants, Lester H. Barber and Myra Barber, which mortgage is recorded in Volume 88, at page 21, of the Record of Mortgages in and for Marion County, Oregon and which mortgage is against Lot 4 in block 14 of Depot Addition to

Salem, Oregon, to be foreclosed and that plaintiff have judgment against said defendants Lester H. Barber and Myra Barber for the sum of \$424.00 with interest thereon from May 1, 1917, at the rate of six per cent. per annum, and for the further sum of \$65.00 attorney's fees, and for plaintiff's costs and disbursements incurred herein.
