A problem of the zoologist is the endurance of freezing by many animals. Collecting the records, Mile, France visit with their daughter, Mrs. and Paul Portier, entomologists, of Paris find that fish have survived 5 decrees F., frogs 8 degrees below, mollusks 184 degrees below and bacteria have come out alive after exposure to 300 degrees below zero. The two French experimenters frozo certain perature just above zero. They became quite solid and brittle and could be broken like feicles. On warming, however, even broken ones returned to life.
