France, July 27, 1918.

We are having some very good weather now. It has never been very hot, some rain but not very wet.

Well, I guess I will have to close for this time.

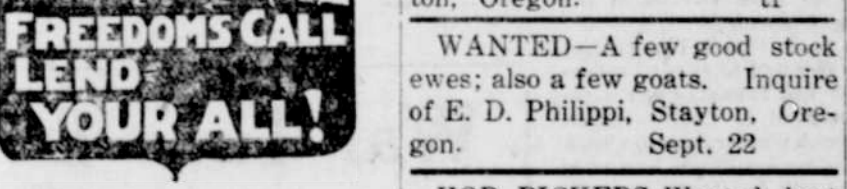
