WAR EMERGENCY COURSE AND CERTIFICATE OEEGON NORMAL SCHOOL

Owing to the scarcity of Teachers the Oregon Normal School will offer a War Emergency Course of twenty weeks outlined by the Supesintendent of Public Instruction. The course will begin with each of the terms commencing Nov. 16, 1918; Feb. 8, 1919; and April 12, 1919. The Superintendent of Public Instruction will consider it equivalent to the Teachers' Training Course and issue a certificate upon its completion valid to teach in the elementary grades for one year.
