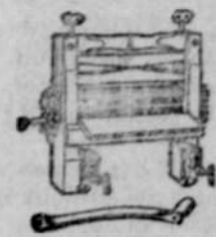
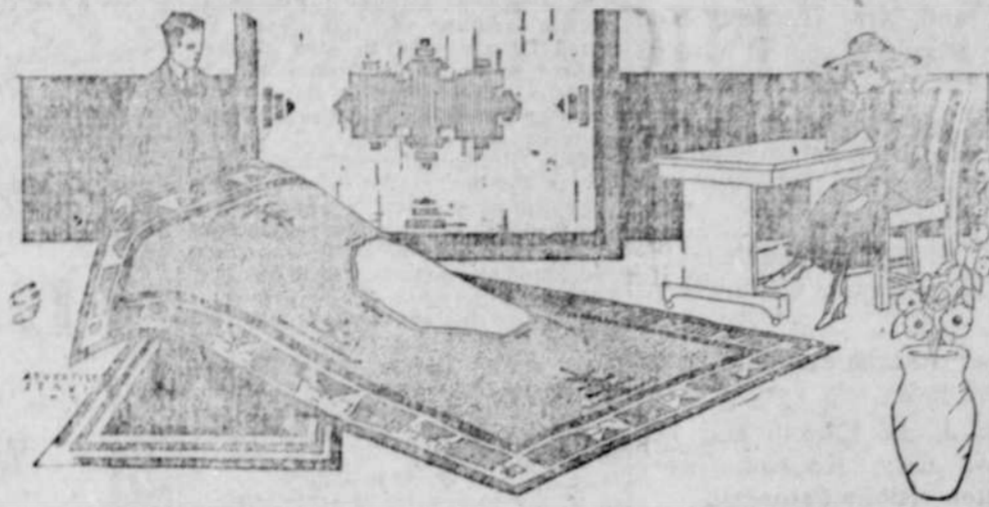


We Have Captured
