Election of state officers and the naming of delegates to the national convention of the American Legion at Minneapolis, Nov ember 10,11 and 12 will be the chief objects of the convention in Portland. There will be accretted delegates from every post of the American Legion in the state-there are now 31 -but the meeting will be open to all members of the organization,
