According to the plans of the Roosevelt Memorial Association, the Roosevelt Memorial Fund of \$5,000,000.00 is to be utilized to erect a National Monument in Washington, D. C., to acquire and maintain a public park at Oyster Bay, N. Y., and ultimately to include Sagamore Hill, the Roosevelt home, therein, to be preserved like Mount Vernon and Lincoln's home at Springfield; and to endow a National Society to perpetuate the principles and ideals of Theodore Roosevelt.

Each contributor to the fund will receive a certificate of membership in the Roosevelt Memorial Association. A certificate will also be presented to every school contributing to the fund.

The name of every contributor will be placed on the list of names deposited in the National Monument to be erected at Washington, D. C.

HIGH WAGES AND STREET CAR FARES

The following appeared in the People's Forum column of the Fort Smith, Arkansas, Times Record and it is good American horse sense reasoning on the public utility problem.

"Every upstanding and fair-minded man knows that the street car people should have, under present conditions, a six-cent fare. Any one can see the automobiles cut into their revenue. People are often standing on the corners waiting for the cars and an automobile comes along and takes whoever wants to go. The trades unions object to the increase to six cents yet they strike and get a raise to suit their fancy. The carpenters simply announce their pay will be 87 1/2 cents an hour, or one dollar, and it goes, but if the street car company wants six cent fare hell breaks loose. It is hard to account for this animus against street car companies. The forward looking men should see that inquisitions against a city's one best asset should be promptly chloroformed in order that private property may not be jeopardized and that all may enjoy what they have accumulated by their own industry and far-sightedness."

PLUNGING STILL MORE WIDELY

The failure of the Fargo Scandinavian bank for \$1,500,000 with Non-Partisan League activities owing the bank three-quarters of a million, has attracted nation wide attention.

A. C. Townley, head of the league, with characteristic activity has set machinery to work to rehabilitate the dusted bank in truly Non-Partisan League style and methods.

The bank had only \$50,000 capital and \$10,000 surplus. At a mass meeting Townley planned to increase the capital to \$800,000 and called upon the farmer members of the Non-Partisan League to take the stock. He made an impassioned socialistic address for two hours, called all who did not believe in political banking hard names and enemies of the common people and ordered a street parade.

The mass meeting paraded the principal streets led by a band as a demonstration of financial stability and then the powwow adjourned subject to the call of the master mind and his assistant potentates.

In the mean time a loan of two millions for state farm loans has been floated at par by the state putting up an equal amount of cash in outside banks to guarantee the loan and paying interest before it is due.

This little bank with \$750,000 loans to Non-Partisan league socialistic schemes alone is just a sample of what North Dakota can look forward to with a political class organization such as the Non-Partisan league in control of the state government including an official state bank, etc.

Other states where the league is seeking to establish its socialistic form of government can well afford to see how North Dakota fares before swallowing the Townley schemes, hook, line and sinker as North Dakota has.

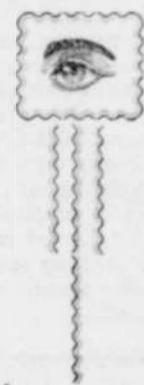
