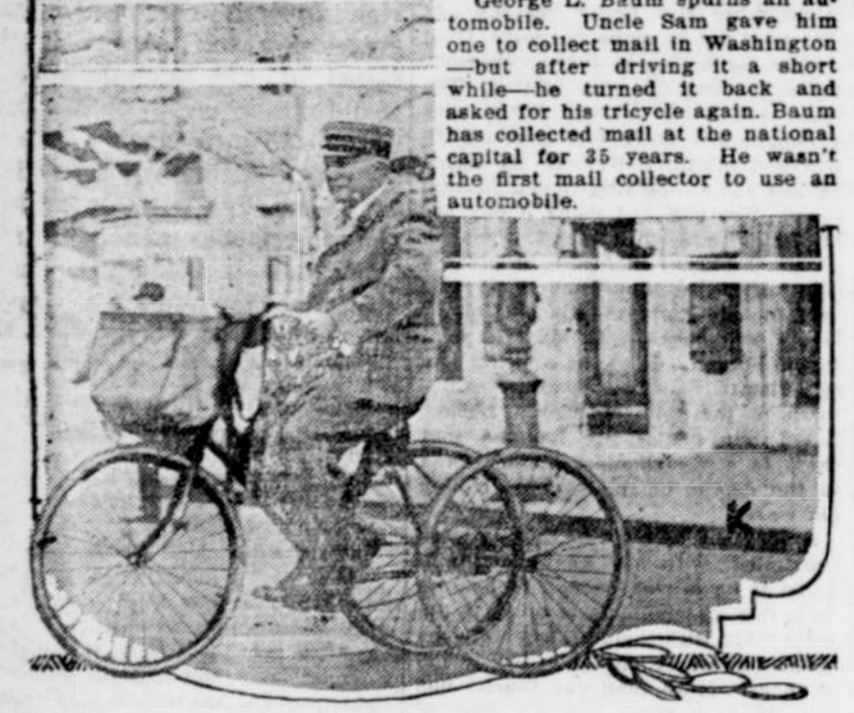

OUR CAPTURED FLAGS ABROAD

Emblems Taken During the War of 1812 Are Safely Preserved in London.

A recent walk through Chelsea brought me to several places of interest to Americans. Firstly, the old Royal hospital, built in the reign of King Charles II, the great hall of which is now used as a recreation room for the old pensioners and from whose walls a number of flags captured during the 1812-1815 war are suspended. The colors hang sedately side by side with Napoleonic eagles and other war trophies, and if it were not for the records it would be almost impossible to discern their story. Among them are flags of the Sixty-eighth and Eighty-fifth regiments captured at Blandensberg; the Kentucky regimental flag, the Fourth regiment of United States Infantry, taken at Detroit; the Second regiment of the United States Infantry and another taken at Queens-town Heights.

I wonder how many Americans know of their existence. It would certainly be a graceful act of the British government to return them to America. No doubt the American authorities have some similar trophies which they would be pleased to exchange.—London Landmark.
