INDIANA IS FIRM

Politicians Can't Deliver It to Presidential Candidate.

Indianapolis, Ind.—No politician or group of politicians can deliver Indiana to any candidate for the Republican nomination for the presidency, Frederick A. Joss, national vice chairman of the Leonard Wood campaign committee, declared today as he left for Chicago to assume his duties.

"I am prompted to make this statement by newspaper reports that Indiana members of the house and senate have declared the state's delegates eventually will vote for one of the political stable, Lowden or Harding," he declared. "I hope these reports are incorrect for no delegate will be so foolish as to ignore the overwhelming mandate which the presidential primary of May 4 will dictate for Leonard Wood."

"Indiana is almost solidly for Wood and every delegate will be for him."
