- 1 FOR THE CHURCHES WORK AT HOME.** A more efficient use of our own funds. Can we do more with the English language. What is to carry forward this best work of Americanization. If the church does not?
- 2 FOR HOSPITALS AND HOMES.** Every year the thousands of men and women sent away from their homes because of lack of room. The children's homes are crowded to turn away more children than they can receive.
- 3 FOR HIGHER EDUCATION.** Of the United States supports in institutions of higher learning, one-half are in sufficient financial condition to support by the churches. Many of these institutions have had no great endowment campaigns, but their needs are just as pressing as the needs of larger schools and you have only to read their list of annual appeals to realize the value of their contributions to America.
- 4 FOR RELIGIOUS TRAINING.** At least 12,000,000 children and young people under 25 years of age are entering American life without any religious training at all. Remembering the faith of Washington and Lincoln, do you think that America will continue to produce Washingtons and Lincolns if faith dies out of the hearts of its youth?
- 5 FOR THE CHURCHES WORK ABROAD.** Indians come from the Orient thirty years ago; nearly all religions are Oriental religions. So long as China has only one physician to every 100,000 people the Great Wall continues to be a menace. So long as India has only one doctor for every 100,000 people, the British Empire is a menace. A Christian doctor or teacher sent abroad is working for America as truly as though he worked at home.
- 6 PREACHERS' SALARIES.** The preacher is called the "forgotten man," and well he may be. Eight out of ten preachers are paid less than \$20 a week!

Each denomination has its own detailed budget, and will administer its own funds. Your pastor has copies of the budget; examine them for yourself. WOOD DECRIES PATERNALISM

Tells Michigan Audience People Must Not Depend on Government for Everything.

Escanaba, Mich., April 1.—Leonard Wood, addressing a large audience here today, declared "that paternalism in national government is fatal to American progress."

"No man can run the whole show," he declared, "and the higher most men get in the world the more they realize it. You can't run the world by verbal message, and the people who depend on the government for everything from the price of sugar at the corner grocery to the regulation of industries soon will grow helpless."

"People must rule in order to learn how to rule," he said.

SALVATION ARMY MAKES MEN OF SOCIAL OUTCASTS

Following a well known rule the Salvation Army, in its industrial homes, is taking the class of man who early finds his way to the poor house and rehabilitates him, makes him over, gives him confidence in himself and turns him over to employment that enables him to sustain himself.

The County Government makes its "down and out" habitual indigents. It makes them a monthly allowance of money or goods for which it requires no service.

The Salvation Army takes the same man and gives him, not money, but work.

It pays him money for his work, and renews in him the knowledge that conscious and directed effort is entitled to, and will bring him commensurate return.

It bathes him and wins him again to clean habit and thought.

It builds up his strength and his morale until he is fit again for the fight with the world.

Then it finds him employment and sends him forth to work that he is fitted to do.

Here in a nut shell is the story of the Salvation Army's Industrial Homes in Portland, where scores of men from all over the state have found themselves.

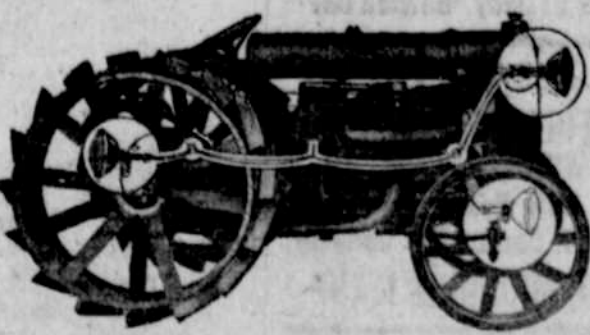
