Notice of Intention to Improve Streets

To whom it may concern, Notice is here by given that the Council of the town of Stayton, Oregon, has by Resolution declared its intention to improve that portion of Ida street, beginning at the West boundary line of Luettich's Addition to the town of Stayton, and extending to the West line of Second street in said town, by scraping earth from the sides of said street sufficient to level up said street, and sub grading the same for a width of 44 feet on each side of the Center Line of the street, and graveling the sub grade with screened gravel to a depth of 6 inches.

Said Council also declares its intention to improve that portion of Water street beginning at the East line of First street and extending to the West line of Second street in Bursons Addition to the town of Stayton, by restoring the grade and sub grading the same for a distance of 44 feet on each side of the Center line of the said street thereon a layer of Course gravel four inches deep under the wheel track and outward to the outside of the sub grade, and placing upon said layer, a layer of Screened gravel four inches deep the full width of the sub grade.

LABOR UNITED FOR WOOD

Leaders See Through Attempts to Kill Him Off and He is Now Stronger Than Ever.

Chicago, April 1.—The growing enthusiasm of labor for the candidacy of Leonard Wood for president is becoming a more striking feature of his canvass for the nomination every day. Carl Young, president of the Michigan State Federation of Labor, says: "Labor has seen through the efforts of the administration to kill Wood with the labor vote. Efforts to this end were made by sending Wood to Omaha, Gary and the coal fields of West Virginia. The hope was entertained by the administration that Wood would ruin himself with the labor element."

At Tokamah, Neb., a poll was taken and Wood received 99 votes. Houser 16, Hitchcock 11, Pershing 10, Edwards 4, Johnson 2, Louisa 2, Lansing 1 and Wilson 1. At Fairbury the officers of the post had difficulty in keeping members from passing a resolution indorsing Wood for the presidency.
