Dundee Honors Beatty.

The Lockit Book of the burgesses of the city and royal burgh of Dundee, Scotland, was opened the other day, and to the names of high 61stinction already inscribed therein the name of Earl Beatty was added, "in recognition of his great services to the empire and in testimony of the high esteem entertained by the citizens of Dundee for his distinguished achievements in the service of the state," Dundee received the distinguished Admiral and Countess Beatty with all the exphernat enthusiasm of a city on the borders of the North sea, which was the theater of operations, as it was the baftle ground of the grand fleet. Earl Beatty spoke of the rapidity and efficiency with which the ship-repairing resources of Scotland had been converted to the services of the fleet, and pald a tribute to the bravery of Scottish fishermen when acting as minesweepers:
