Physician Declares "Balmy Sleep" May Be Obtained by Following Advice He Gives.

The other day a medical man, consulted by a patient who feared insomnia, instead of prescribing the expected drug, merely told his patient how to sleep. The threatened insomnla was banished, says London Answers. One should lie on the right sidenot because this affects the heart, but because it relieves pressure on the digestive organs. But the right side is not "a full right." There should be a slight tilt to the left, so that the right shoulder blade, and not just the shoulder, takes the weight.

The proper position is to elevate the feet three inches or so higher than the head and just to "crook" the legslightly. Hend pillows should not be used, or but just a small one. And that should come under the neck. Nature's pillow is the sleeper's own

arm, curved. Bed clothing should be just sufficient for warmth. Overweight or overtightness-some sheets are tucked in much too tightly-induce restlessness, which may easily develop into insomnia, which is as much a habit as a
