Another Pioneer Passes Away.

Nicholas Lambert passed away with a stroke of paraly vember 10, 1916. He was born in Ireland June 28, 1829, being 87 years 4 months and 13 days old. He crossed the Atlantic Ocean at the age of 14 years, went to Wisconsin where he lived for two years. He then went to New Orleans, where he while there married Miss Bridget Coulon. They moved to Missouri in 1858 where they resided until and located on his farm northeast of Sublimity where he resided till September 23, 1915, when he went to live with his son P. H., where he stayed until his death. He was a lifelong Democrat, having fought for the south in the Civil War. His wife died October 23, 1876. Several years later he married Mrs. Elvira Branch who died August 12, 1907. He is survived by six children, N. J. Lambert of Grandview, Oregon, Mrs. Mary Tate, Sublimity, Ore., P. L. S.
